# Curbside Yard Waste Pick-Up

Curbside yard waste pick up (for the in town residents only) is provided by the
Town every Tuesday from March 1st to June 30th.
Then starting July 01 - November 30th, it will switch to Thursdays. Place
containers and bundles at the curb before 7:00am on those days.

#### Acceptable materials include;

- Grass clippings

- Leaves

- Branches no larger than 4 feet long and 4 inches in diameter. Branches and limbs must be bundled.

#### Unacceptable materials include;

- Rocks and concrete

- Sod and soil

- Ashes

- Items in excess weight of 45lbs

- Items in excess lenght of 4 feet

- Household hazardous waste

- Tires

- Regular trash

Residents will be required to place items in recyclable paper bags or loose in plastic containers clearly labled "Yard Waste".

Anything in plastic bags will **NOT** be picked up.

# Recycling

Dumpsters and recycling officers will be behind Town Hall every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month from 9:00am until 5:00pm. To see the full list of acceptable materials to recycle, please follow the link below.



YARD WAST

Here is a small list of what is acceptable to recycle;

-Clean food and beverage cartons
-Paper, paper mail, and paper boxes
(any paper material WITHOUT a glossy finish)

-Aluminum/steel cans and tins
-Clean glass, plastic bottles, tubs, jars, and jugs

## A Letter from Burgess Chad Weddle:

Since the pandemic, the Town has continued to operate and provide the residents services like water, trash pick-up, and police protection. The Town, due to the county closure of the mulch pile, has contracted for weekly curbside pickup of yard waste. This occurs on Tuesdays until June 23rd. The next pickup will be Thursday July 2nd and then every Thursday. Please place items out on Wednesday night beginning July 01. This service runs March 1st til November 30th.

Trash remains on Wednesdays and again, we encourage you to place your trash out Tuesday evenings since pickup can occur beginning at 6am on Wednesdays.

Recycling through Frederick County is every other Monday, such as June 15th, June 29th, July 13th, etc.

Please sign up for The Walkersville Wire to stay up to date with Town events, water main breaks, road closures, etc. - sign up at Walkersvillemd.gov

The Commissioners' unanimously adopted a budget that LOWERS property tax in Walkersville from 16 cents to 14 cents per \$100.00 of assessed value. That results in a \$50.00 savings for a home assessed at \$250,000.00

The Town will be bringing online a new water plant soon. This new water plant is able to treat contaminants that shut the system down entirely in 1999 and 2008. The water system covers more than just residents in the Town of Walkersville. The water system bills every six months, not quarterly as most other municipalities and Frederick County does. Thus, most residents pay at least \$95.00 quarterly to Frederick County for sewer costs.

For water customers, you will see a \$25.00 assessment on your Nov. 2020 bill, and that surcharge will end no later than Dec. 01, 2022. This is to help the water fund while we assess the costs to operate the new plant.

The Town will be prioritizing capital work projects such as;

- Remodeling Town Hall to be fully handicap accessible in the meeting/voting area.
- Upgrading the 1972 maintenance area to provide covered space for all Town Hall equipment.
- Paving Creamery Park and the streets in Town.
- Increasing security camera coverage.
- Upgrading playground equipment.
- The Town also voted to add another Maryland State Resident Trooper to bring the total to six. This Trooper would not start until at least July 01, 2021.
- The Town has also added a new position called the Communications Specialist (please welcome Samantha Fowle) to help improve getting information out to residents through the website, The Walkersville Wire, and Facebook. We have begun Live Streaming meetings on the Town's Facebook page, and we hope to add YouTube soon.
- Shred day is Saturday, July 11th beginning at 9 a.m. and going until noon behind Town Hall.

I appreciate everyones patience and consideration during this pandemic as we all deal with a unique and novel virus.



after the meeting,



# A Note from Commissioner Michael Bailey

Gardening in the Time of COVID

Hello Walkersville neighbors and happy almost summer.

About a month into Governor Hogan's "Stay at Home order" my wife, Alana, and I decided to embark on a new adventure. One that has not only given me hope during this time but has also shed light on the great work that often goes unnoticed by members of our community. We decided to rent a garden plot at Heritage Farm Park.

Now for those of you who don't know, I was an Agriculture Extension Agent in the Peace Corps in Senegal for two and a half years. I worked and managed a hospital garden that provided produce to overnight patients. It was an incredibly fruitful garden. However, if you had seen the gardens I attempted to cultivate over the past three years, you would have strong doubts about the actual extension that I did. One year we only had jalapenos, like 100. Another year only tomatoes, again like 100. Maybe I was just better at growing things in the Sahel Desert.

Therefore, I wasn't sure what to expect with this garden. What I found was a community of gardeners willing to help, converse, and share their knowledge. I also was astounded to learn that part, if not all, of the produce from three of the plots are used to provide produce to the Glade Valley Food Bank.

During this time of social distancing and isolation here are people (six feet apart of course) connecting with each other on a weekly basis and some working to provide produce for those in need. Whether it's sharing transplants or tilling a neighbor's plot to help with weeds (thanks Mark), the connection is real and meaningful. It's these connections that are going to help us get through this time and build lasting relationships as we move into the future.

Now we have a lot growing in our garden however, the verdict is still out if we get any produce from our toils. Regardless, it is still a joy to work the earth with my wife and kids and meet some incredible people in the process. If you're ever at Heritage Park and you see a short guy wearing a hat working plot 25, feel free to stop by and chat, it should be me. Let's connect, let's learn, and let's get back to the basics with our families and community.
